Two thousand years ago the Romans invaded Britain and then stayed there for 400 years. The Britons didn't learn Latin and continued to speak their Celtic language.

The Angles and Saxons came from Germany, and spoke a Germanic language. They invaded Britain and pushed the Celtic speakers into Scotland and Wales.

George V . The King of England during World War One and grandfather of Queen Elizabeth II.




